



Identity: The Japanese are descendants of immigrants who came to the islands of Japan around the 15th century B.C. from mainland China. They are thought to be more related to the Koreans than the Chinese, though scholars are unsure how to classify their language, which is one of the world's few linguistic isolates.

Lifestyle: The Japanese enjoy one of the highest standards of living in the world. Though they have few natural resources, their economy has grown to be the second largest. The Japanese are 80% urbanized and their capital Tokyo is the largest city in the world (35 million people).

Customs: Japanese culture is a curious mix between the ancient and the modern. Sumo wrestling, judo and karate exist side by side with baseball, volleyball, and table tennis. Gardening has developed into an art form for the Japanese, and it is enjoyed as a hobby

by men and women, young and old alike. Traditional ceremonies and festivals are still observed by many Japanese, though a wide cultural gap is emerging with the youngest generation, which has been called the *nissi*, or new race.

Religion: Mahayana Buddhism entered Japan from Korea in the 6th century. Since that time it has become intertwined with the Japanese religion of Shintoism, which literally means the "way of the gods." In practice, Shintoism involves the veneration of ancestors, various deities, nature, historic leaders and the emperor. As a result of this syncretism, Buddhism in Japan has splintered into hundreds of sects, some of which are quite large, such as Sokka Gakkai with its 17 million adherents.

Christian Outreach: The Japanese once regarded Christianity as a foreign and destructive influence. But today that is changing. Most Japanese now prefer to have a Christian-style wedding and among young people, over 60% view Christianity favorably. However, this has not translated into church growth despite the presence of over 3,500 evangelical missionaries in Japan. In fact, this is part of the problem. The gospel has never become Japanese, with strong indigenous leadership and contextualized worship.

How to Pray:

There are 1,733 Japanese towns without a local church. Ask God to raise up Japanese church planters to go to each of them.

5 70% of Japanese churches have less than 30 members, and attendance averages 33% on a weekly basis! Pray for revival.

Over 900 universities and colleges are without a Christian fellowship, yet college students are proving to be the most receptive to the gospel. Pray that all 3 million college students would be evangelized.

5 Japanese society is stratified, and the elite have never been reached. Pray for spiritual breakthrough in every segment of society.

S Ask God for the emergence of a truly indigenous Japanese church.

Every year, 1.1 million Japanese die without Christ.
